### **Immunization Action Item!**

- NC state immunization law requires **ALL students, including those participating in the virtual academy**, are up to date with immunizations by the 1st day of school (August 17)
- There are <u>no extensions</u> for this date. Seniors are now required to have the **meningococcal vaccine**. Also, for Seniors a 2nd meningococcal vaccine may be required for students by 17 years of age or entering 12th grade.
- You are encouraged to immediately check with your provider to ensure your child is up to date and provide the school with an updated copy of the shot record.
- If you do not have a healthcare provider, you can call **919-562-6300** to schedule an appointment at the Health and Human Services Northern Regional Center.

## Attendance, Exams, Etc

A student is considered present for daily attendance during a remote learning day if either of these statements are true:

- If a student completes their daily assignments, either online or offline; and/or if a student is present in synchronous instruction.
- If a student has a daily check-in, a two-way communication, with each course teacher as scheduled
- A student cannot be considered absent solely due to not logging into an online resource/lesson on a remote learning day. A
  student will be marked as "present-off-site" based on evidence of student engagement. A teacher who has a face to face
  interaction, e.g., virtual meeting or phone interaction, with a student on that current day can mark a student "present-offsite."
- A teacher may change a student's attendance based on evidence of student engagement that is collected after the current day due to completion of work that is turned in at a later date.

### **Exam Exemptions**

WCPSS high schools are asked to observe the following guidance for senior exam exemptions in 2020-2021.

"Students will be exempt from their exam for any course that does not require state testing and for which the student has a final average of C or better. For the 2020-2021 school year, absences will not be considered in the determination of senior exam exemptions."

#### College Days

In general, students who are away from school for educational reasons are granted excused absences. Seniors whose educational absence is college-related, can have the absences deemed a "college day" if proper attendance procedures are followed, and paperwork is submitted prior to the date of absence. When planning college visits, colleges and universities offer many different dates and times. Make efforts to avoid missing school days, as much as possible.






